JONES SPEAKS ON FUEL ECONOMY

Robert T. Jones, formerly of Langley now at Ames, recently told the National Academy of Sciences at Berkeley, California, that supersonic planes can be made to operate with about the same fuel economy as present forms of transportation.

With swept-back wings to minimize air resistance at supersonic speeds and with designs permitting operation at 60,000-foot altitudes waste of fuel can be avoided, Jones said.

Designs for planes intended for flight in such rarefied atmosphere tend to make them capable of flying slowly in denser, low altitudes for landing.

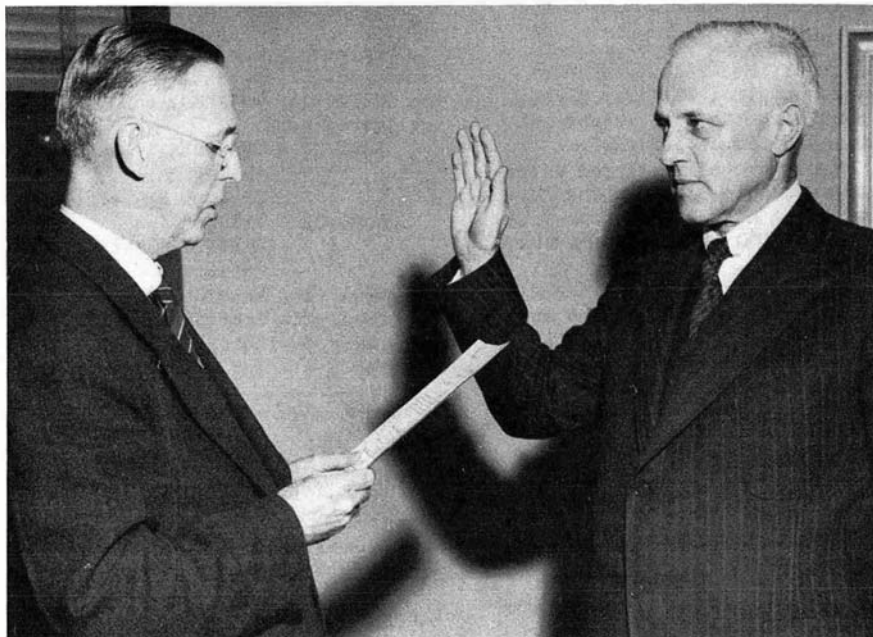
SPORTSMEN'S NIGHT PLANNED FOR DEC. 2

predicted, the present turbojet engine would not fall far short of equalling the fuel economy of more conventional engines.

A new propeller-tipped supersonic parachute has been developed to bring back information from atmosphere 100 miles or more above the earth.

General Electric engineers say their "rotouchute" can be shot from a rocket at the peak of its flight and carry 20 to 30 pounds of delicate instruments safely to earth. The rotouchute slows its speed as it falls. Ordinary parachutes are ripped to shreds in passage from great heights.

As the rotouchute falls into the denser air surrounding the earth its blades begin revolving. Gradually they are forced into a horizontal position, breaking the speed to 27 miles an hour.

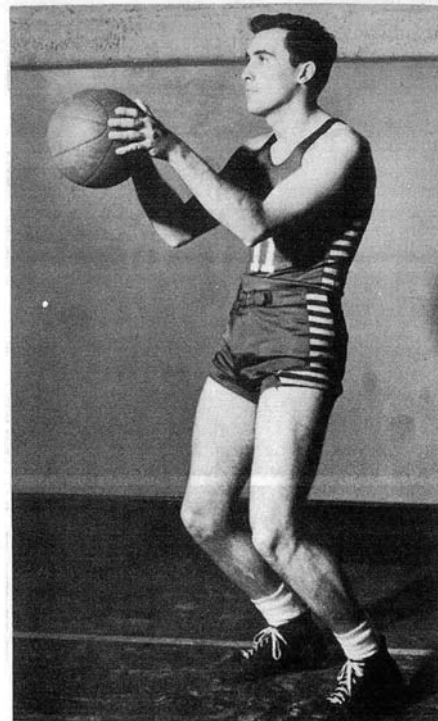
